Dear Friends,

As we look at 2012 it already looks like a very busy and exciting year. But let us tell you how 2011 ended.

Mike – The master’s course will happen for the next two weeks, Jan. 9th – 20th. It is not clear how many will attend, but it appears that it will be even more than last year. *Please pray that that would be the case.* We even have our first international student, coming from Peru to participate.

We took a big step forward in the accreditation process. On Dec. 9, we were invited to formally begin the process. Now we are trying to organize to begin the two- to three year-process that will hopefully result in the Bible Seminary’s accreditation. But more than that, it should help improve the quality of the Seminary at a number of levels.

The new school year at the Seminary will begin on Feb. 6. *Pray that God will call many new students to study.*

Ann – At the end of 2011 the radio ministry of Mosoj Chaski was given an anonymous gift of \$50,000, a real answer to prayer. It takes the financial pressure off, but only for a little while. Please pray that during the coming year we can significantly build our regular donor base. Once we have a more secure financial base for the radio, we would like to start a new, much needed project, which is producing audio-visual teaching material in Quechua. We have wanted to do this for the last three years, but our financial limitations have prevented us from starting it.

We have just been informed that Mosoj Chaski has received the National Religious Broadcaster’s International Radio Ministry Award for 2012 as the outstanding radio ministry outside of the US. The award will be presented at the NRB convention in February 18 to 21, which Ann will attend.

Projects – Due to the SIM office moving, there are three projects/ministries that need to move from our old office property from where they have been operating. This property has been sold, and in March these three ministries need to find a new location. *Please pray for us as we look at different options that the Lord will help us find somewhere that is suitable and within our budget.*



Ann was happy with the final evaluation in November of the camping ministry, El Puente, in La Paz. Now they have the challenge of implementing the recommendations. Ann and Carla hope to meet with the board of El Puente every month via Skype to work on this. *Please pray for good, clear communication and that they will be able to quickly strengthen the existing board.*

Family – Christmas is always a busy time, even in Bolivia. On Christmas Eve we had some Bolivian friends over for a meal, a traditional event in Bolivia. They were all single mothers with their children, who do not have family here in Cochabamba. We had a fun time playing games and everyone had a present to open. On Christmas day a number of mission families got together for Christmas dinner. There was lots of food and a good time with friends and colleagues.

Between Christmas and the New Year we took three days to go to Toro Toro, a small town about four hours away. There are dinosaur footprints, canyons, and best of all, spelunking in a cave. But afterward we were all conscious of muscles we didn’t know we had!
